

WINE LIST

The guests at this wine dinner had a unique opportunity to taste wines of outstanding quality and impeccable origin because the wine cellar of Château Palmer sent the following sorts for the first time ever on Tuesday, 8th September 2015:

VIN BLANC DE CHÂTEAU PALMER 2010

It is produced only in the best vintage years in a limited series of 1.200 bottles. It is not sold freely; it is not in wine lists and it is not accompanied by the notes of the most appreciated world wine tasters. Many collectors have tried to give money for this wine with a mythical status. They have never succeeded in it.

Only when the Château management believes that an event and its guests deserve to witness the uncovering of the myth, an approval is given for opening several bottles of this unique white wine with an extraordinary blend: 50% Muscadel, 35% Lozet and 15% Sauvignon gris.

ALTER EGO DE CHÂTEAU PALMER 2010

The second label of Château Palmer and its interpretation of the excellent vintage of 2010. Its blend is: 51% Cabernet Sauvignon, 49% Merlot and 14.4% alcohol. Robert Parker 91/100.

ALTER EGO DE CHÂTEAU PALMER 2005

The blend of this wine is dominated by Merlot 57%, while the remaining 43% belongs to Cabernet Sauvignon. A great vintage. The right moment for getting to know it.

CHÂTEAU PALMER 2005

In Margeaux wine-growing region there are as many as 21 classified vineyards, but only one can challenge the quality of the famous wine produced by celebrated Château Margeaux – that is Palmer. Robert Parker evaluated the wines from both places from the famous 2005 vintage with the same top-ranking grade 98/100. Palmer is more available and reasonably priced!

CHÂTEAU PALMER 1998

Palmer is known for a high percentage of Merlot in the final wine blend. Merlot has dominated the blend for only several years, for example the 1998 vintage – 52% Merlot, 43% Cabernet Sauvignon and 5% Petit Verdot.

CHÂTEAU PALMER 1989

Finally, there are years when Palmer not only challenges the wines of Château Margeaux but indisputably makes much better wines, judging by the wine tasters' notes. The wine of 1989 vintage changes a view of the world and gives us the reason to believe that immortality is possible in the world of wines!

CHÂTEAU PALMER, historical 19th century blend L.20.07

In the end, some more evidence in favour of unusual and unique Palmer and his striving to exceed all expectations. Historical Palmer represents a classic blend of Cabernet, Merlot and Syrah from the Rhône region. If you wonder about this Bordeaux wine containing Syrah from the Rhône, don't worry – it is a classic blend from the 19th century.
